### EMORY UNIVERSITY ATWOOD CHEMISTRY CENTER, ATLANTA, GA



The expansion of the Atwood Chemistry Center brings 70,000 SF of new space and the renovation of about 40,000 SF of existing space. Featuring sustainable design and building techniques, the project was built to the University's environmental stewardship standards and is certified LEED Gold. The addition is a hub for Emory's growing science commons, providing a gathering space for science departments across campus in the center atrium and hosting a new science library on the second floor.

### UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA GENETICS MEDICINE BUILDING, CHARLOTTE, NC

The Genetic Medicine Building, designed by Lord, Aeck & Sargent Architects, is a state of the art research building. At approximately 333,000 SF, it is one of the largest buildings on the University of North Carolina Charlotte campus. The facility houses the School of Pharmacy, as well as the departments of Genetics, Biochemistry and Biophysics and Pharmacology. The circulation spaces are tied together by a dynamic, daylit atrium space. CD+M supported the interior lighting design of public spaces under contract to Atlanta-based design architect Lord, Aeck & Sargent.



### GEORGIA BIOSCIENCE TRAINING CENTER, SOCIAL CIRCLE, GA



This 43,000 SF facility houses state-of-the-art laboratory spaces, classrooms, computer lab, meeting rooms, administrative spaces and all associated storage and functional spaces. The building also includes a large multi-purpose conference space, and a small general food service area. It received a 2016 AIA Georgia, Design Excellence Award. The spaces were organized around a central ellipse shaped event space courtyard which is open to the sky and lined with glass walls, infusing light to interior circulation and breakout collaboration spaces. Diffused "borrowed" light then passes into the training spaces.

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
